### **Year 3 Trip to Verulamium**

On 5<sup>th</sup> June, Year 3 went to Verulamium Museum in St Albans. At the museum, they had a workshop where they were able to handle objects that were almost 2000 years old. Some of the children even dressed up as the Romans did. They looked around the museum, intrigued by the artefacts that had been discovered in and around St Albans. They learnt about life in Roman times, as well as some elements of Celtic Britain. After lunch in the park, we walked to the Hypocaust and the children could see a Roman, under-floor heating system. We also found time to visit the ruins of the Roman wall, which used to surround the town of Verulamium.







### **Year 4 Trip to Hatfield House**

On 5<sup>th</sup> June, the year 4s enjoyed a fantastic trip to Hatfield House. They were transported back to the Tudor times and upon arrival were greeted by Nicholas Man of arms, who gave a dramatic performance explaining the life and times of the 1500s. Thereafter, they had a guided tour around the premises before meeting Catherine Parr and Thomas Tallis who prepared them for their meeting of Henry VIII. When meeting Henry VIII, they paid reference and performed a song, *Sumer is Icumen In* for his enjoyment. The interactive workshops were a wonderful visual representation of their learning and the year 4s experienced living history and a taste of Tudor life. The visit ended with lunch in Bloody Hollow before returning back to school and the 21<sup>st</sup> century.
