Asthma pumps & Epi-pens

Staff received annual training on the signs and symptoms of these conditions, alongside the use of the appropriate medication.

We have been advised that, ideally, we should have 2 epi-pens in school for each child however it is recognised that this isn't always possible.

In addition, we have been told that ALL children and adults (regardless of age) should have a spacer as they provide a more efficient way of administering the medication in some circumstances. For further guidance please see the link below.
