Year 4s visit to the Anne Frank exhibition & St Albans Cathedral



This week Year 4 were the next to step back in time to the Roman times. Before the Romans we had very few roads and, knowing that the quickest way to travel was in a straight line, they built them in a straight line! They also introduced the idea of lining in big cities and towns.



They also introduced their own number system and language – Latin.



The children also visited the Anne Frank Exhibition. Anne Frank was a young Jewish girl who hid in 1942 from the Nazi's during the occupation of the Netherlands. Whilst in hiding she wrote a diary. Two years later she was discovered but parts of her diary remained. In 1945 she sadly died from exhaustion in the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp. Her diary has since been translated into 70 languages.

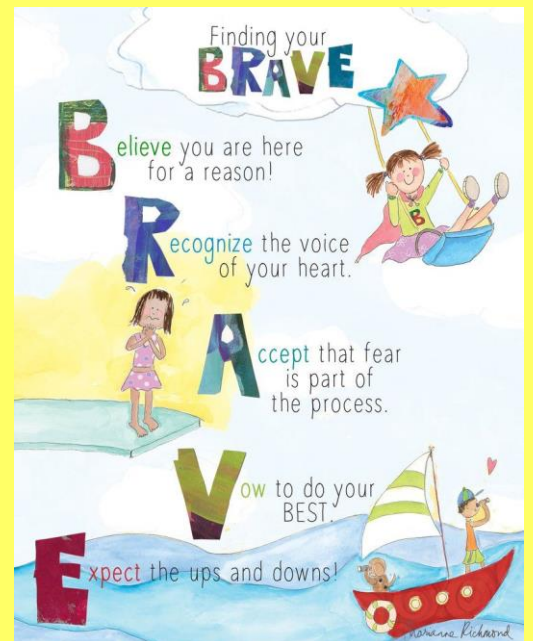
