Welcome Letter

Dear Parents/Carers,

Please have a look at the exciting topics we will be learning about this term! Below is a summary of this term's curriculum, forthcoming activities and homework timetable.

English

Each term our learning is centred around texts that will cover a variety of genres and purposes. They will link to some of our curriculum topics, to enhance and enrich the children's learning experience. These texts include: Planetarium, Hidden Figures and Where the Poppies Now grow. Each teaching sequence will allow the children to immerse themselves in each text through a variety of activities and writing outcomes. There will be an emphasis on spelling, grammar and punctuation throughout all units of work.



Spelling

In Year 5, we will continue to set spellings each week. The lists will be set every **Monday** with focused activities during the week and a test on the **Friday**. Throughout the week, children are encouraged to find words at school and home that fit this rule and to use them in their writing.

Maths



In Maths, we will be developing our knowledge of 'Number and Place Value' and the 'Written Calculation Methods' for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We will be developing our knowledge of fractions, decimals, measurement, statistics and geometry. There will be a focus on mental recall skills and improving the speed and accuracy of times tables.

Science

In Autumn 1, we will be studying 'Earth and Space'. This unit covers the relationships between the Earth, Moon and Sun in our Solar System. We will explore: sizes, orbits, night and day and why we have seasons. After half term, we move onto 'Properties and Changes of Materials' where the children will learn about different materials, their uses and their properties, as well as dissolving, separating mixtures and irreversible changes. Mint will attend HABs every Monday afternoon for science lessons this term.

Computing

In Computing this term, we will be learning about Computing systems and networks and creating media. Children will be able to explain the input, output, and process aspects of a variety of different real-world systems. Active learning will be encouraged through guided questions and by working in small groups to investigate the use of devices and software.



History

We will carry out a historical enquiry that focuses on the Suffragettes. We will use a variety of sources of evidence to ask and answer key questions.



Geography

The children will learn what life is like in the Alps. They will discover the climate of mountain ranges and consider why people choose to visit the Alps. Children will explore human and physical features of Innsbruck and discover what makes it attractive to tourists.

Music

In the Autumn term, all the children in Year 5 learn to play the cornet with Matthew Kenny from Brass England. Each child has their own cornet and it can go home each week, but will be needed in school every Wednesday.

Art and D & T

In art, the children will be developing our painting techniques as we study the life and work of Pablo Picasso. Children will be given the opportunity to their sketching and painting skills using hot, cold and complementary colours. In D&T, the children will be learning to develop a recipe. They will be taking a traditional bolognaise sauce and improving the nutritional value before cooking their own version and creating packaging for their product.

PE and Games

The children in both classes will need to wear their PE kit to school on Tuesday for games lessons with ELMS. In addition, Year 5 will have dance lessons on a Friday afternoon and will need to come to school in their PE kits.



RE and PSHE

The focus of RE in Year 5 is Christianity, Judaism and Buddhism. This term, we will have the following lines of enquiry: why do people stand up for what they believe and why doesn't Christianity always look the same. In PSHE, we will explore two topics: 'Being Me in My World,' and 'Celebrating Difference.'

Homework

Homework will be sent home each week to be completed in your homework book. Homework will be set on **Thursdays** and will be due in the following **Tuesday**. Spelling words will be sent home on **Mondays** and children will be tested on **Fridays**. All logins and passwords will be written in your child's reading record. Children also have a Times Table Rockstars account and are expected to **spend at least 30 minutes on TTRS each week**. Homework will be sent home on a Thursday as follows:

We ask that children read for 10 minutes every day either independently or with an adult, including talking about the book that they have read. In Year 5, children are asked to record what they have read and when at least **3 times a week**. We ask that you sign your child's reading record **once** a week to encourage your child to read and for us to acknowledge that reading is being completed at home. On **Friday**, the children's reading records will be checked in school to ensure that they are reading regularly. Should your child's reading record not be handed in or signed, your child will be required to read with their class teacher for part of their break time that week. We encourage your child to communicate openly with us regarding their reading and to change their books independently.
